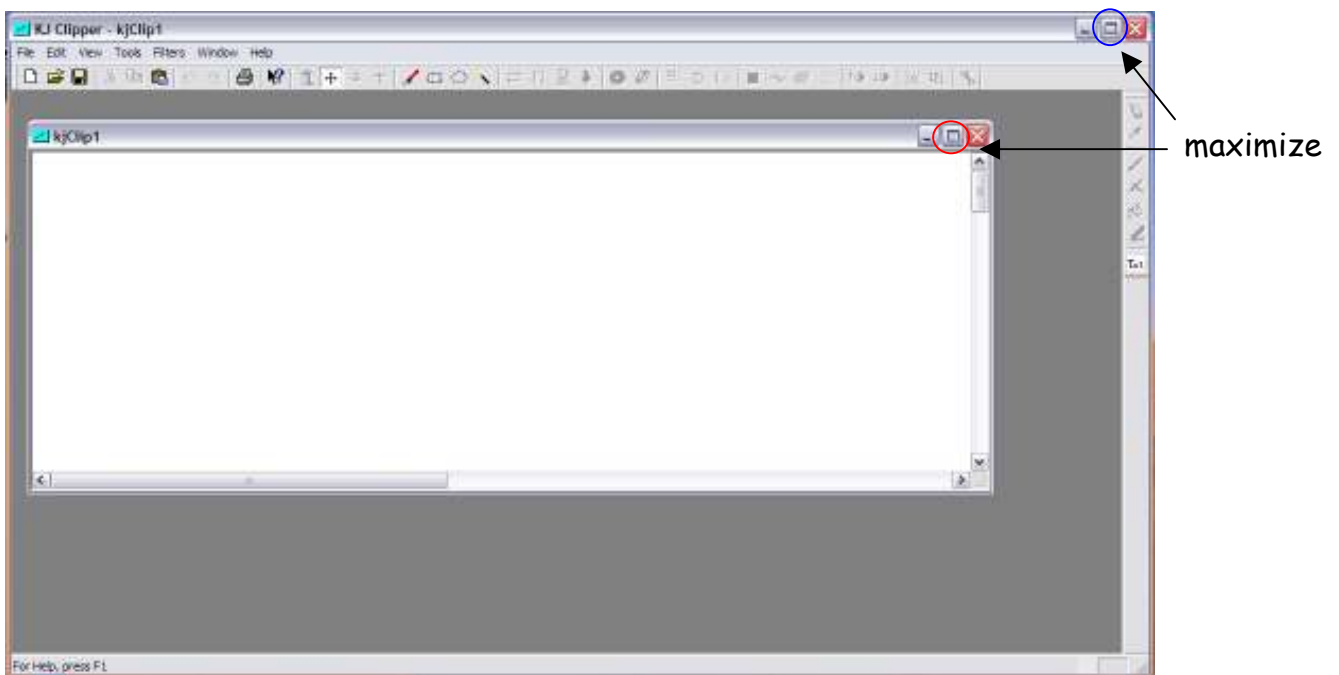


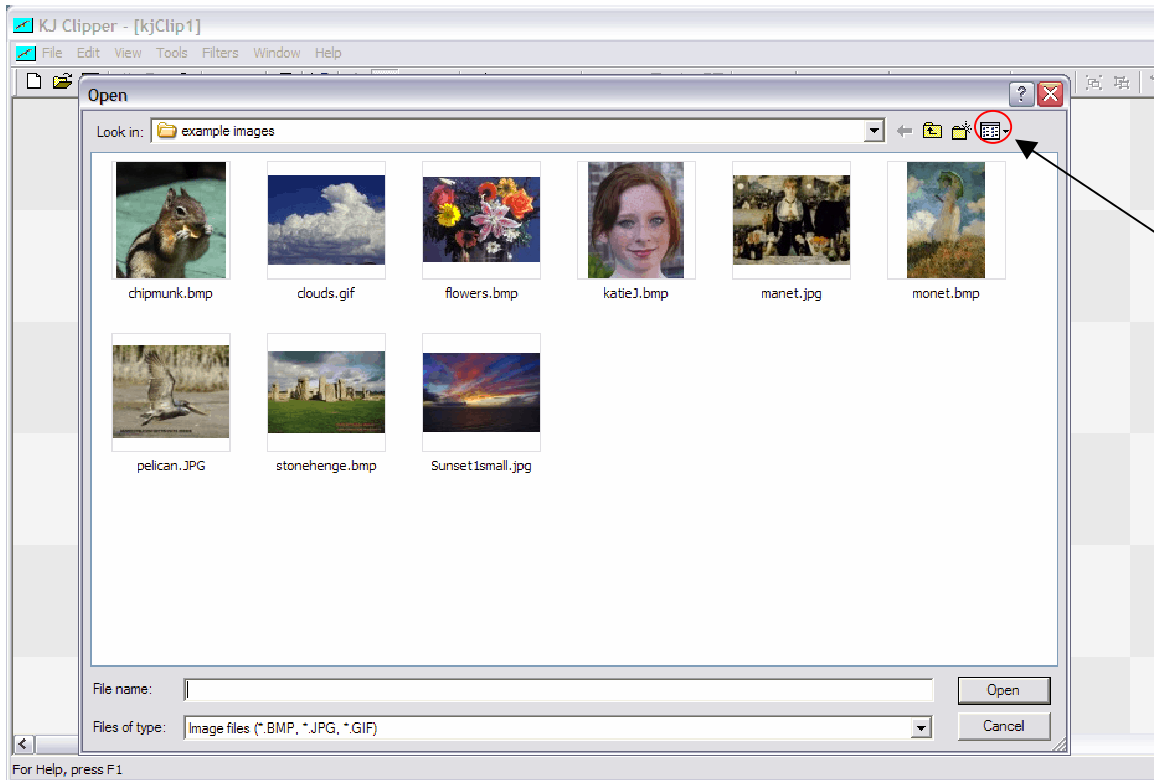
TUTORIAL: Katie in the Sky



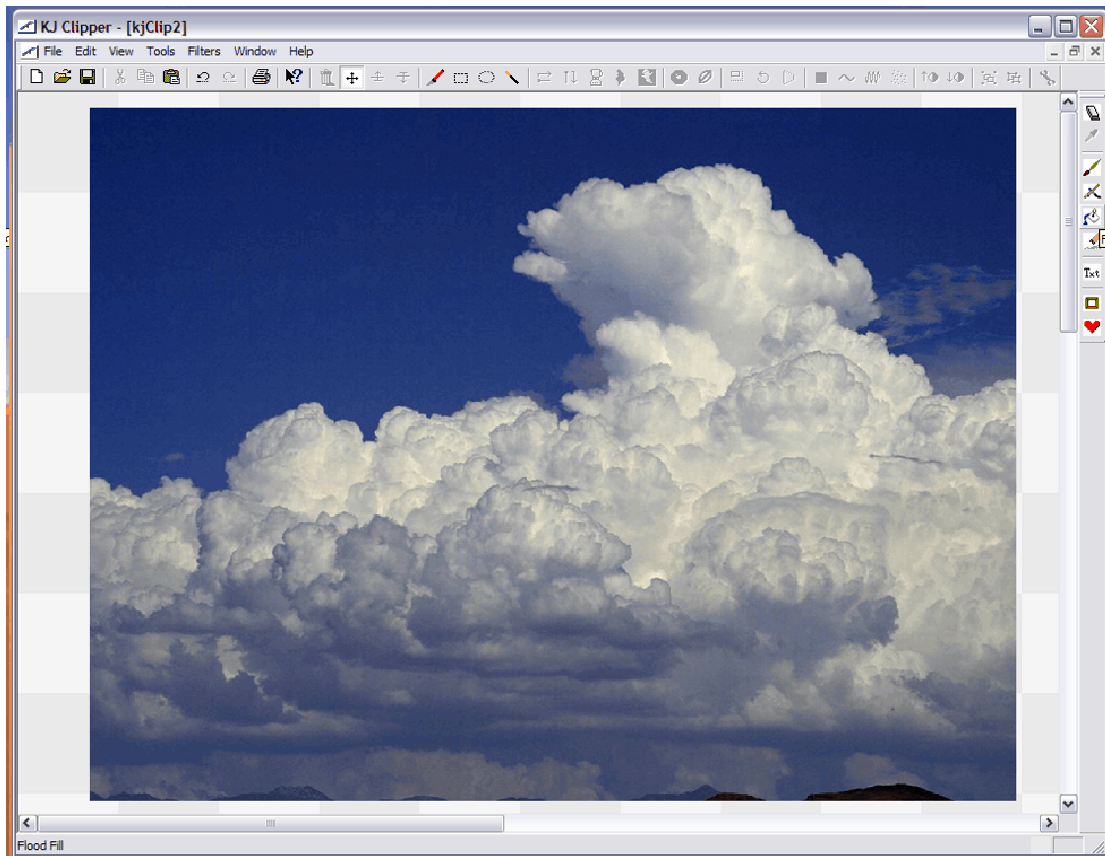
Welcome to the tutorial for "Katie in the Sky." First, run KJClipper and go to the "File" menu at the upper left of the program framework. Choose the "new" command. Your screen should look something like this:



Usually we find it convenient to maximize the amount of canvas we have to work on. To do this, first maximize the framework, then maximize the document window. Next, we'll go to the Edit menu and select the "Insert Object" command. A standard "file open" dialogue will appear. Navigate to the KJClipper product directory, click on the "example images" directory and you should see something like this:

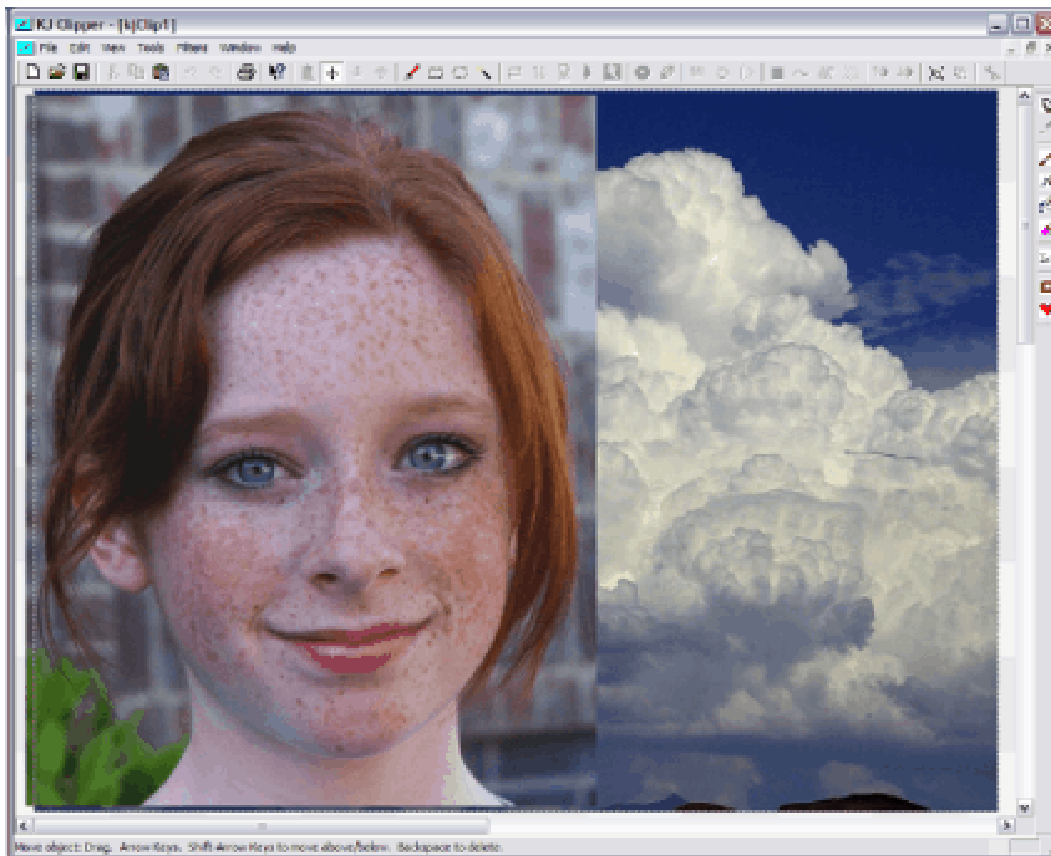


If you don't see the preview thumbnails, you might want to use the "View Menu" to set the mode to "Thumbnails". Double-click on "clouds.gif". You should see something like this:

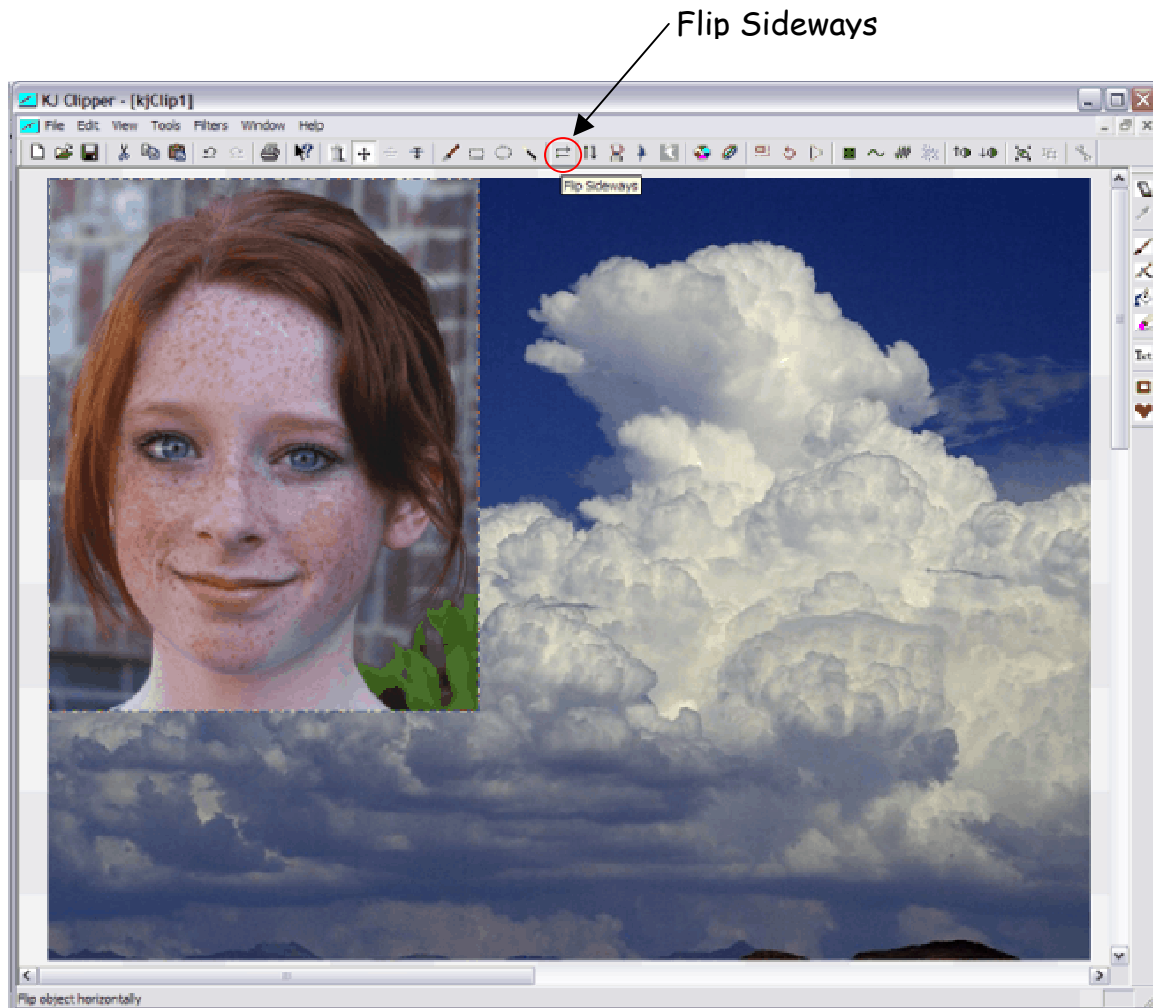


You may have to click-and-drag the photo object to center it.

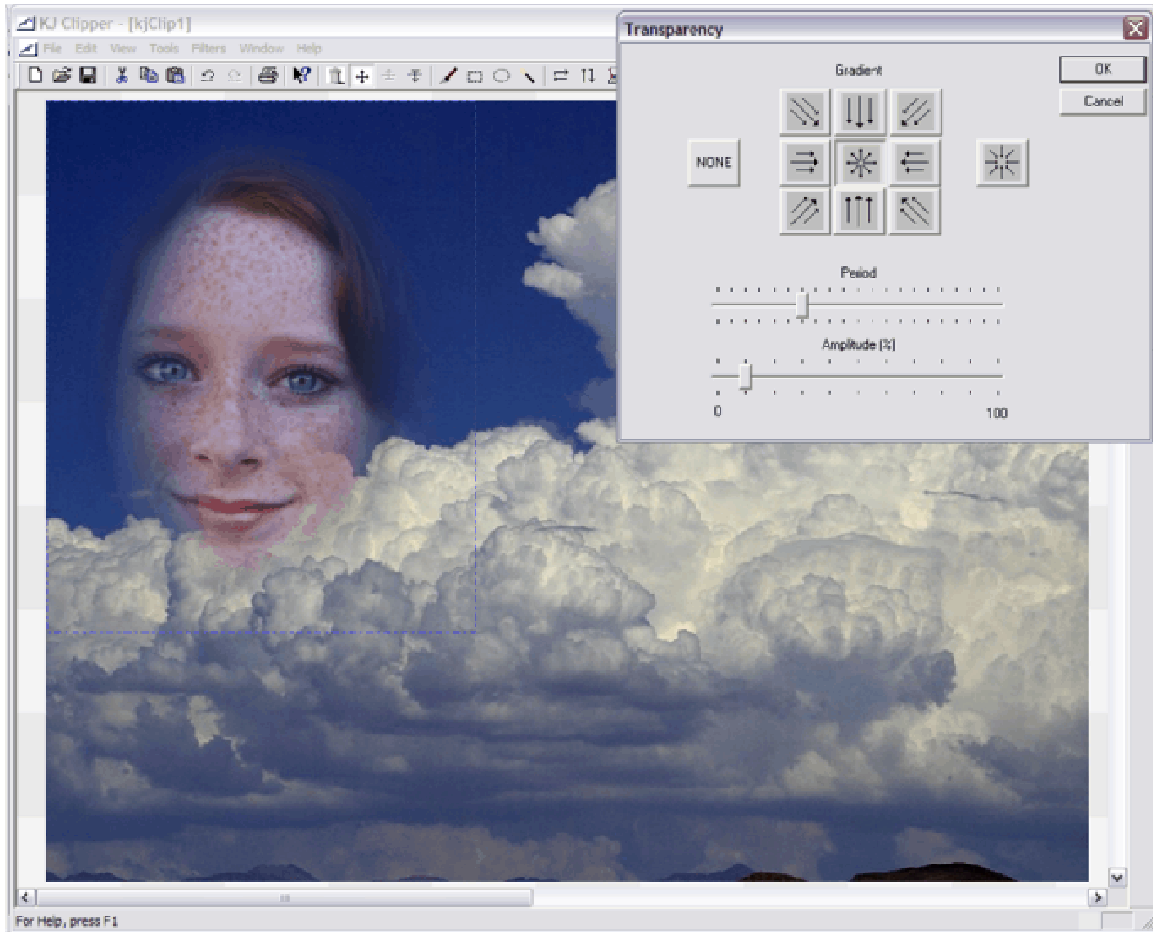
Again, go to the Edit menu and select the "Insert Object" command. A standard "file open" dialogue will appear. Double click on the katiej image file; as before, you may have to move the image into the position shown.



Right click on the katie image and choose resize from the context menu. The image object should now be bordered by a red rectangle. Left click on the lower right corner of the image and move the mouse up and to the left, until the bounding box is about two thirds the size of the original. Release the left button and choose the "flip sideways" button:



Now right click over the Katie image and choose "partial transparency" from the context menu. You should see something like the following screen:



The dialog defaults to the "center out" gradient. Take a moment to play with the controls and gauge the effect of each one. Adjust to suit your taste and click "OK."
